## TEAM REPORTS

### FIRSTS

With only four wins and six losses (with one washout) I guess whenever you finish the win/loss ratio in negative that reflects on what is usually a pretty frustrating season for a team. When three of those four wins were against sides that finished below you on the ladder, then that confirms your thoughts.

The season commenced with great expectations, but a fair comment is that we failed to fire too many shots when it counted.

With early injuries to David Ross, Alan Davie, Pete Edwards, Ben Wells and Lindsay Campbell and the retirement of last year's batting average winner together with the bowling average winner moving on, we can easily paint a picture explaining the lack of results. A true and honest review though tells me that even though these injuries and departures hurt us, they were covered by ably talented cricketers. It is there I prefer to provide my focus.

Jake Prosser came into the side after round two and immediately made an impression against Mt Eliza. Jake played some very impressive innings throughout the year, only usually getting out through his lack of experience in playing senior cricket. Experience will come. Role models were few and far between for Jake and he suffered for that at times. We will need to rectify that – and not only for Jake's sake.

Damien Wust needs to be singled out for his year. Wusty is infectious. He never stops trying. He doesn't spit the chewy if he feels he hasn't had the opportunities he would dearly love. At times he bowled down wind, at others upwind – always dependent upon what the game situation was, and he always accepted whatever role came his way. He may not have won our bowling award this year, but numbers don't always add up the way we want them to Wusty. Be satisfied in your achievements this year, you were clearly one of our best performers week in week out. Thanks for your efforts.

Benny Wells had a difficult year but still managed to take out both the batting and Team Champion award, both most thoroughly deserved. Had it not been for work commitments preventing him from bowling some overs during the week, Ben could have bowled us closer to finals contention – I've no doubt of that. Same can be said for Joppy. Bowling over the wrist is a fine art, and one that needs continual practice. The pleasing scenario for the club however is that together with both these lads and along with Matty Prosser, the spin bowling department is a very potent one.

Batting is where we let ourselves down. One hour into the season and we were 5/24. In hindsight, we never really recovered, though there were some memorable innings.

- Ramma's 90 on day one of the season was sensational, and promised a lot, though unfortunately we didn't see it again for the year
- Benny Wells against both Red Hill and Pines were innings that set up wins for the club
- Joppy's 86 against Delacombe Park was a solo effort that showed the rest of us up on the day
- Jake Prosser had Mt Eliza, Red Hill and Carrum eating from the palm of his hand – three figures should be your next immediate goal Jake, you certainly have the talent to do so.

Our bowling was not spectacular, but it was consistent. What was even more impressive was that whilst bowling to low totals, we were fantastic at times when we didn't get the points and therefore the credit the bowling team deserved. We bowled out finals sides in Hastings for 150 and lost the game, Delacombe Park to 210 and again lost, Balnarring (though they missed the finals by losing their last 2 games but were on top for more than half the year) for 175 and lost the game and Carrum for 190 to knock them out of finals cricket. We had the ability.

We need to be able to attack and defend. Something at times we did well, but not nearly consistently enough. Understand that containing batsmen and building pressure is at times the equal to taking wickets. We also need to better understand that bowling to a field is an art. Too many senior players wanted field changes to match where the ball was being hit – the first sign of a struggling side.

When all is said and done, we did try. No-one could be accused of throwing in the towel. We were competitive at times in every game. We had Seaford 5-140 chasing our 210. In the same game we were 2-110.

We had Mt Eliza 6-160 and dropped catches bled another 120runs. We had wickets in the shed in the run chase against Rye and finished only 4 wickets down but failed in the run chase by 50 runs.

We had Hastings 7-120 defending 150 to lose by 2 runs, and finally we restricted Boneo to 180 only to be cut short by rain and thunder to finish the season out.

Another season provides another group with more opportunities. Alex Coad and David Ross and the slow bowling makeup will be the backbone with guys like Wusty, James Harker and Ben Johnson placing plenty of heat on them to keep everyone honest.

For the batting, if Joppy can train, then he, together with Jake can again take the brunt of the opposition bowling.

Thanks to all for their support this season and I wish all players success next year.
